BISHOP EDDIE G. RICHARDS, JR.

Suff. Bishop Eddie G. Richards Jr. was born November 22, 1946 in Memphis, Tennessee. He was the second of six children born to Eddie and Annie Richards.

He attended Ford Road Elementary School, Porter Middle School and Booker T. Washington High School. While at Booker T. Washington Eddie was a star athlete, earning All-City honors as a defensive back.

He had many offers to play collegiate football. He chose to stay close to home and attend Southern Illinois University Carbondale – where he would earn his bachelors. Eddie loved learning and would eventually go received his master's degree in public administration from Governor's State University.

Suff. Bishop Richards relocated to Chicago in the early 1970's and began driving buses for Chicago Transit Authority (CTA).

He drove 79th Street and Stony Island routes. After a few years of driving, he rotated to bus maintenance and eventually maintenance instructor where he would retire after 25 years in 1997.

While in Chicago he met and married his soul-mate Marjorie Wynn and to that union was born Eddie G. Richards III 'Popi'. Together they shared a total of 6 kids Aaron 'Keith', Antonio 'Pugga', Jocque, twins Jetton and Shonice and Eddie 'Popi'.

Suff. Bishop Richards was baptized at New Jerusalem Pentecostal Church (1977) and later that year received the gift of the Holy Ghost. He made Morgan Park Assembly Church his home under the leadership of Suff. Bishop Robert A. Baggett Sr. After 12 years of faithful teaching in the children's church, God called him to pastor.



On December 3, 1989, Suff. Bishop Richards began his pastorate of Hazel Crest Assembly Church of the Apostolic Faith (HCAC) in the Hazel Crest Community Center. Bible class was conducted at his home on Wednesdays and prayer on Friday night.

Moving forward, HCAC would soon lease space from the Lutheran House of Prayer in Country Club Hills. In July 1993, HCAC purchased the land and church facility at 17801 S. Cicero Avenue, Country Club Hills, IL (retired the mortgage in 3years). Lastly, HCAC broke ground on a brand-new facility in 2003 and completed construction in March 2005.

Suff. Bishop Richards was ordained in the Illinois District Council, April 1991; promoted to District Elder in 1992 and later served as the Council's Vice Chairman for three years. He was promoted to Suffragan Bishop in July of 2007.


Suff. Bishop Richards was an amazing teacher. He always referred to himself as more a teacher than a preacher. His used his gift to enact his calling of "preserving the apostolic doctrine". Everything he did whether it be bible class, Sunday sermon, New Saints class etc. he wanted to instill the unadulterated word of God. His teaching will forever be missed.

After 47 years on the battlefield, the Lord called him home on December 17, 2024 at 3:33 p.m.

Suff. Bishop Richards was preceded in death by his loving parents, Eddie and Annie B. Richard, wife (First Lady Marjorie Richards), sister (Claudine Richard), brother (Darnell Richard), sons (Jocque Richard and Antonio Wells) and daughter (Shonice Richard). He leaves to cherish his memories and the testimonies of faith his sons Jeton Richard (Ingrid), Aaron Keith (Coreatha), Eddie "Popi" and Pete Katranides; siblings James, Diane and Barbara Jean; grandchildren Marquise, D'Angelo, Jahaun, Antonio, Amber, Naujah, Aaron LaRonn, Elijah, Issa, Kyra, Jetton II 'LJ', Autumn, Chloe, Bria and Gabriel and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, relatives and friends.

























